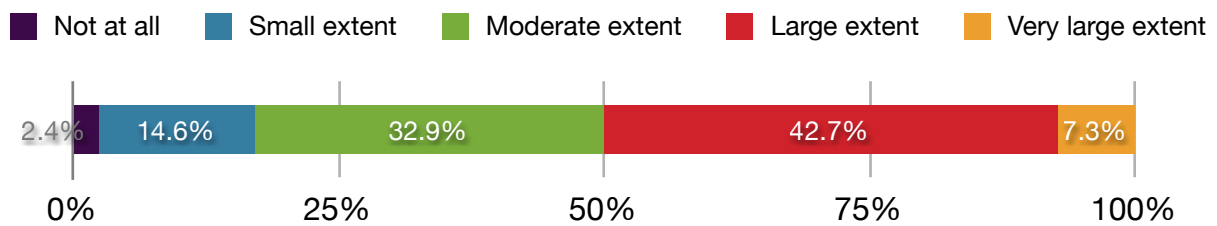

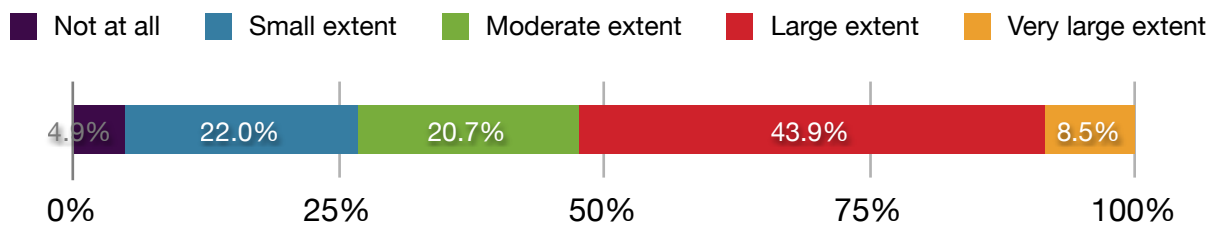

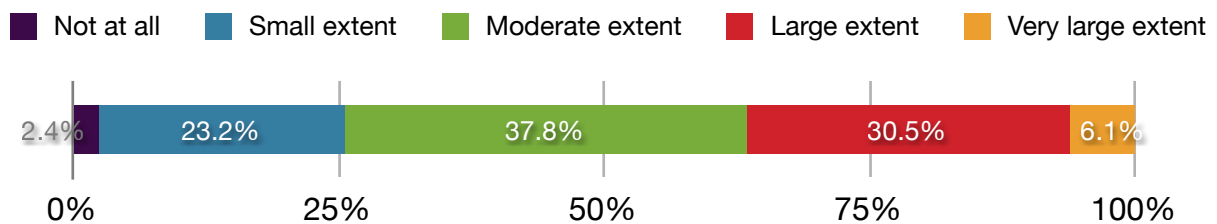
### a) Shown that they care about your learning outcomes?

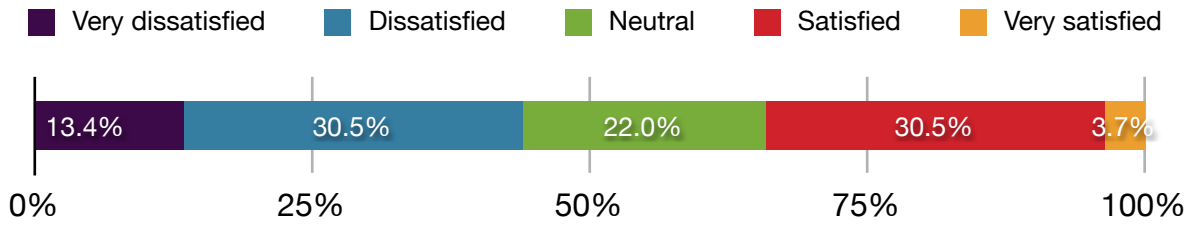

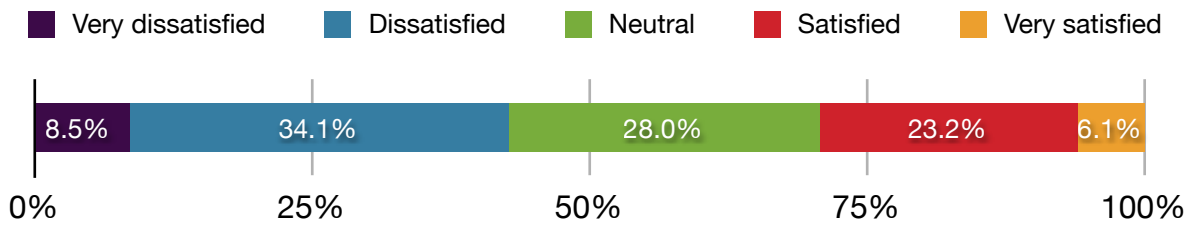

**a) The quality of the feedback that you receive on assessments?**

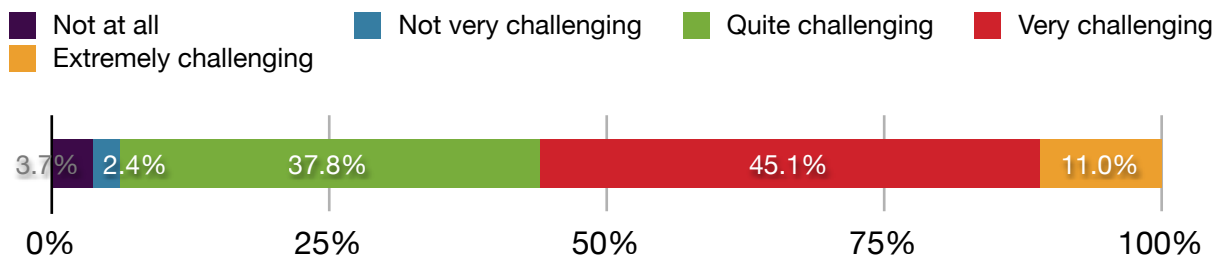


**b) the timeliness of the feedback that you receive on assessments?**



**Question 14: How challenging have you found your assessments?**

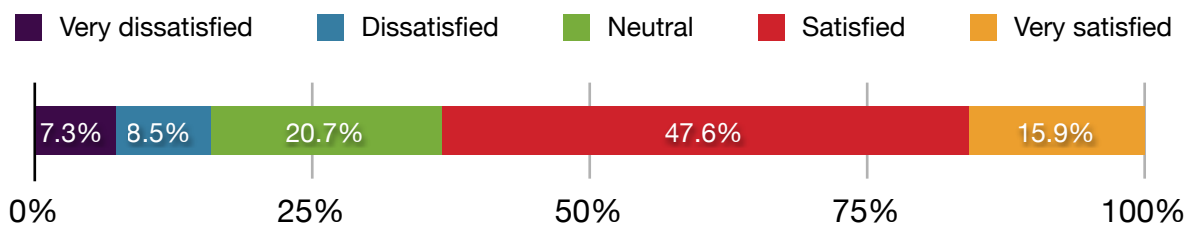

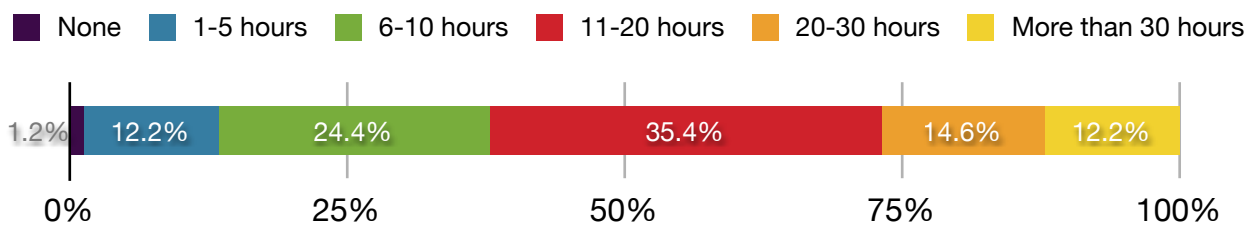

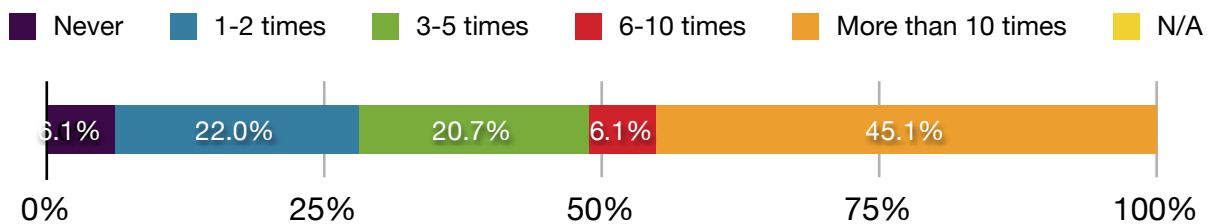
**Question 16: During semester, how many hours do you spend studying (including preparing for class) each week?**

**Question 17: How often do you visit your law school/university library (as opposed to using online library resources) in a typical semester?**

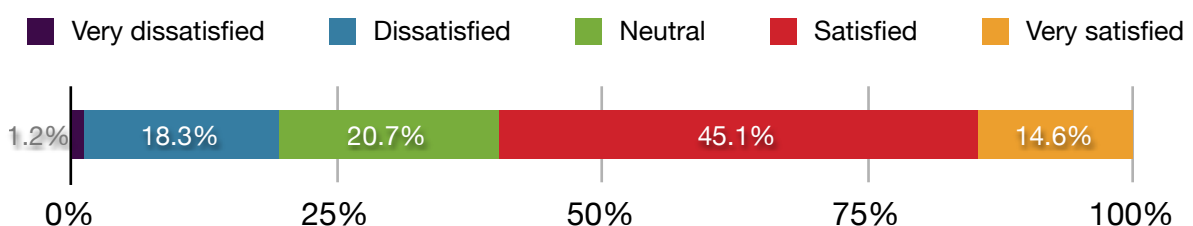

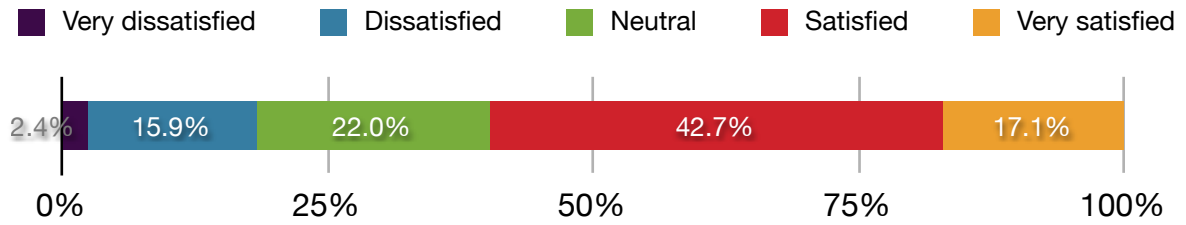

**a) The range of elective subjects available?**



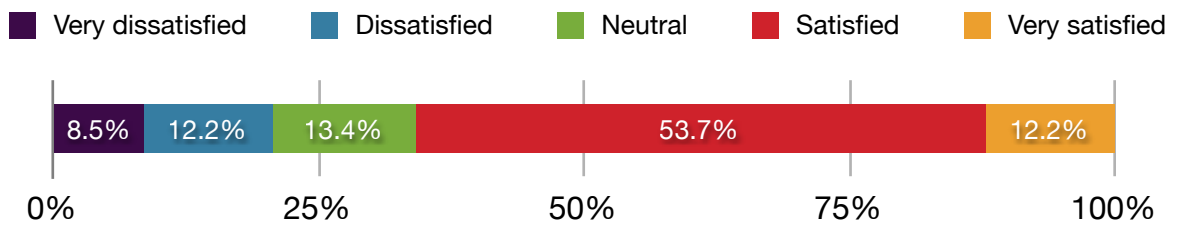

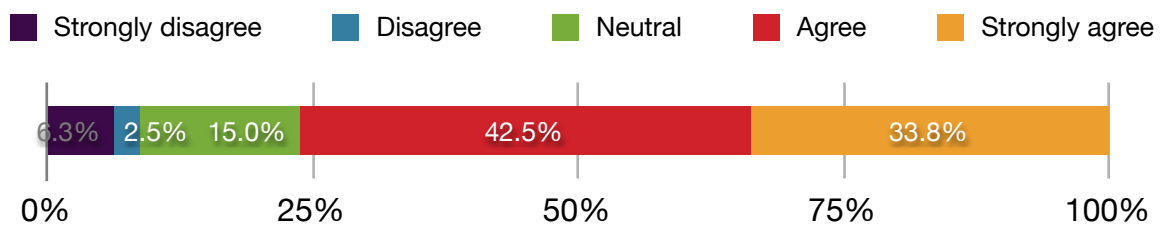

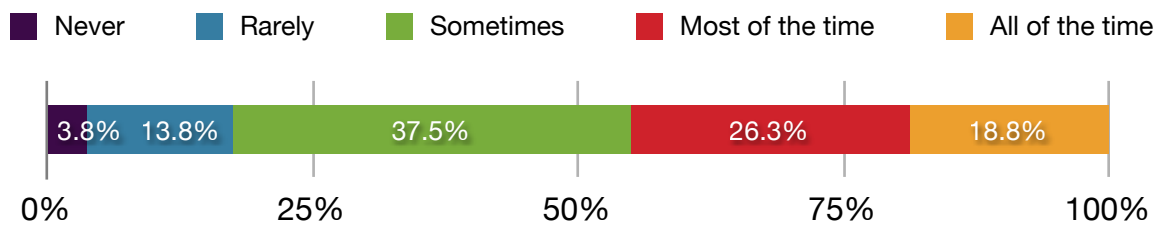
**Question 20: I believe my law school is highly regarded by employers.**

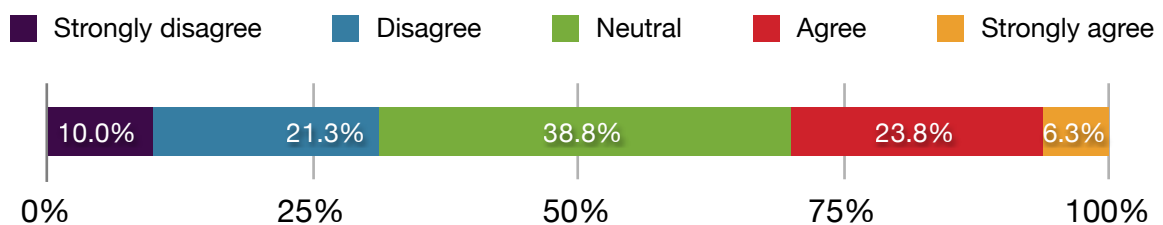
**Question 21: How often do you feel stressed about finding a relevant job after you graduate?**

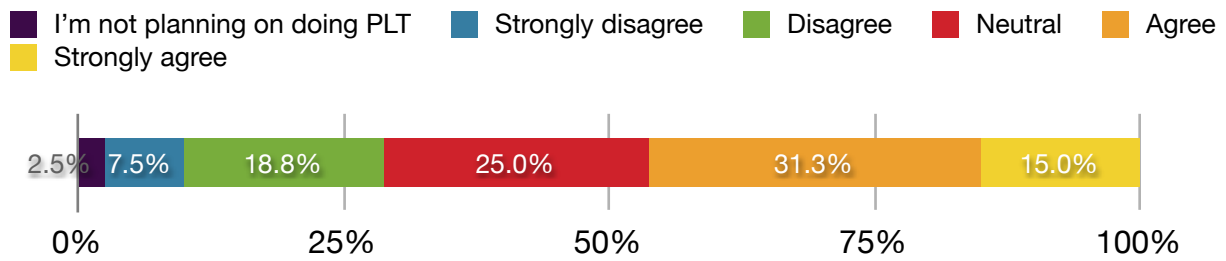

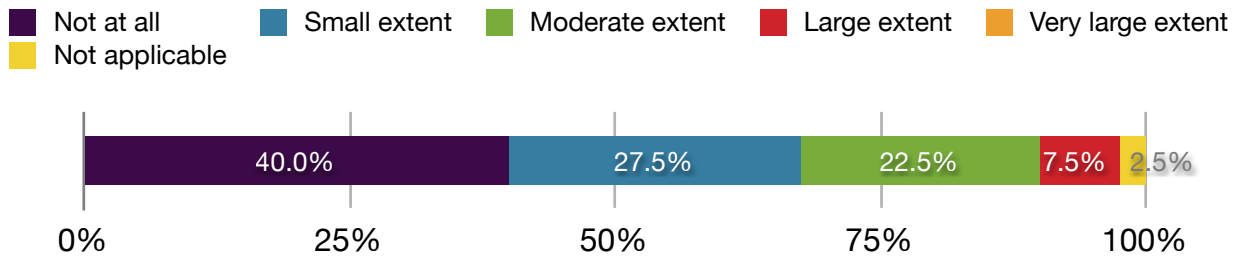
**Question 23: I have access to sufficient information about my practical legal training (PLT) options for when I finish my degree.**

**Question 24: To what extent have you used career support services at your university?**

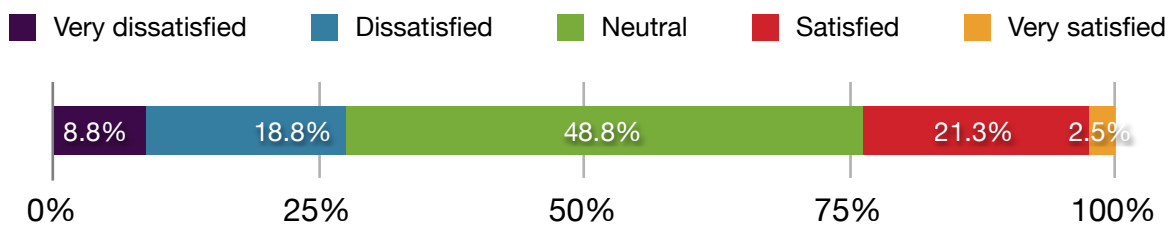

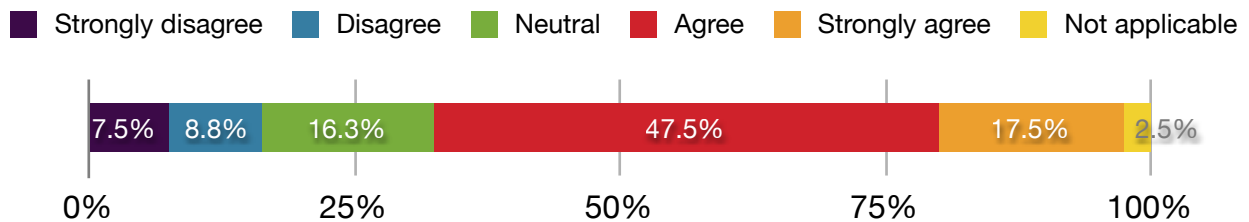

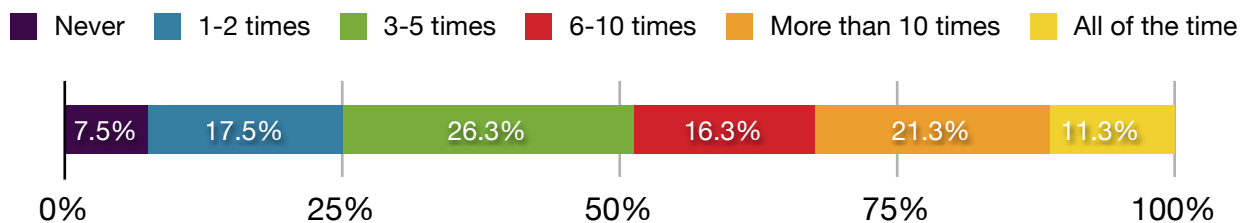
## Question 26: I enjoy spending time on campus at my law school

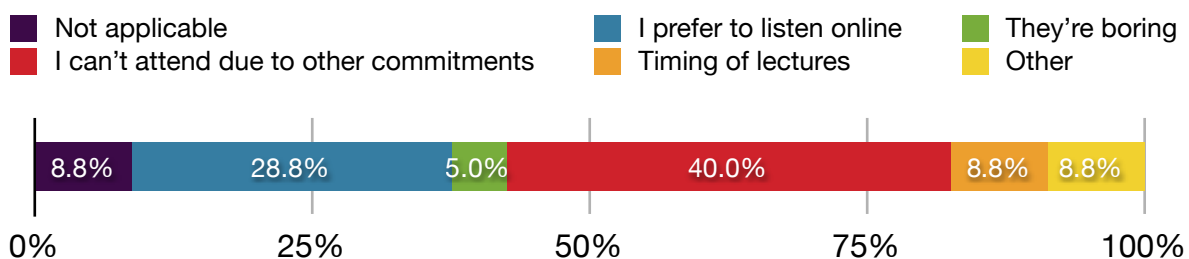
## Question 27: How often do you skip lectures in a typical semester, other than as a result of illness?

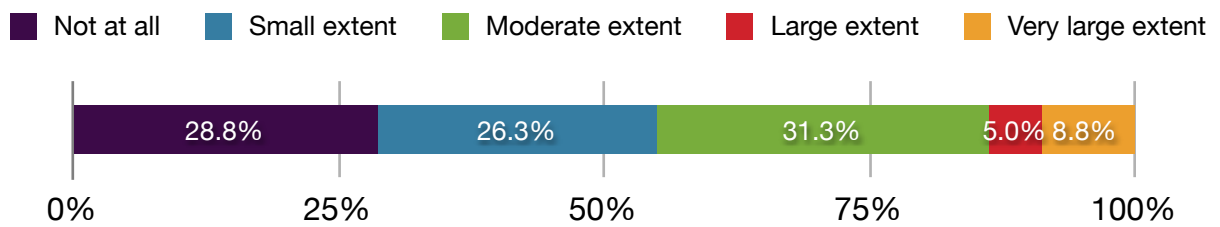
## Question 28: What is your main reason for skipping lectures?

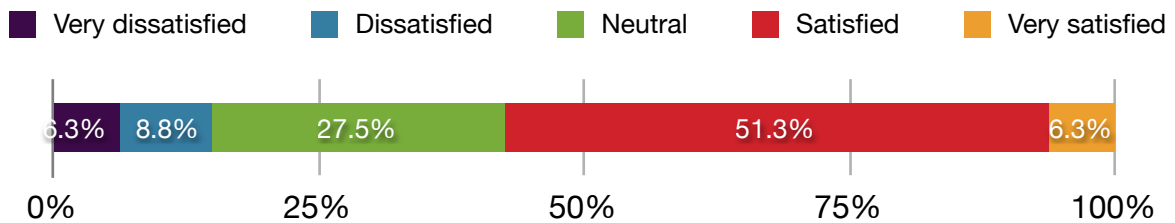

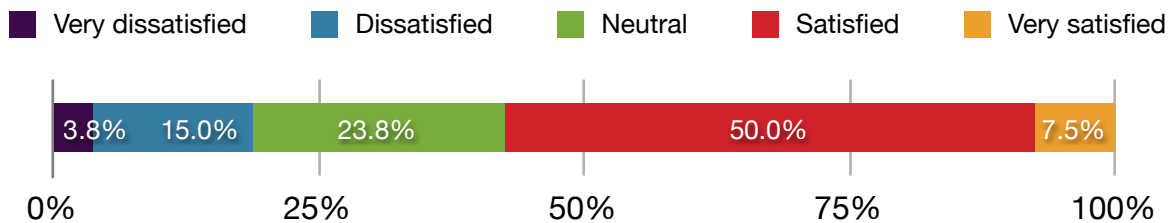

**a) the range of extra-curricular activities available at your law school?**



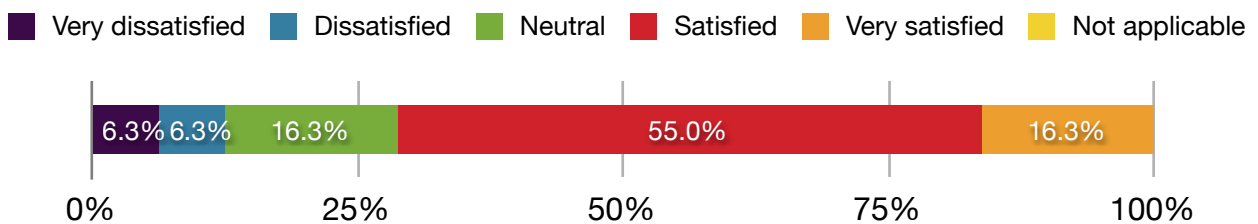
**b) learning facilities at your law school, such as lecture halls and classrooms?**

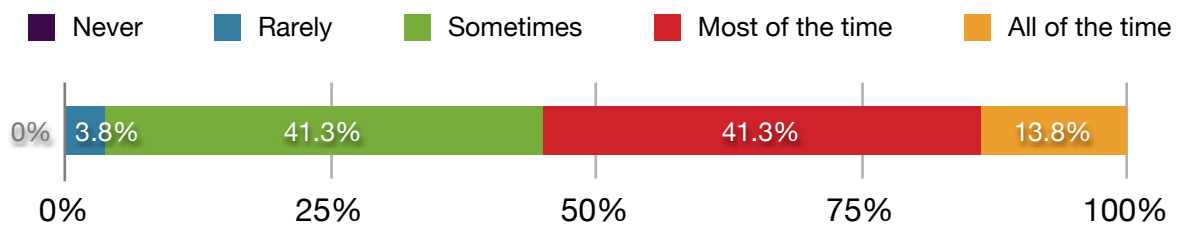

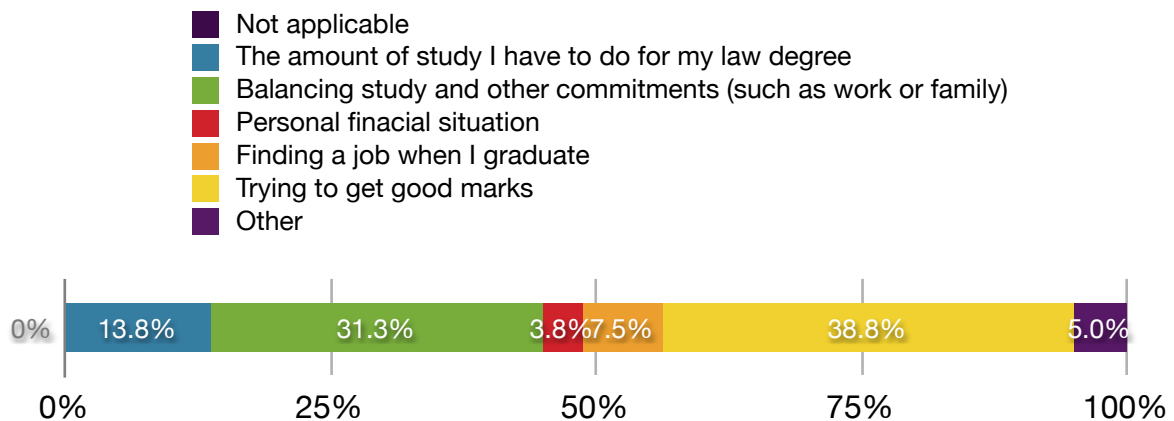
## Question 32: How often do you feel stressed at law school?

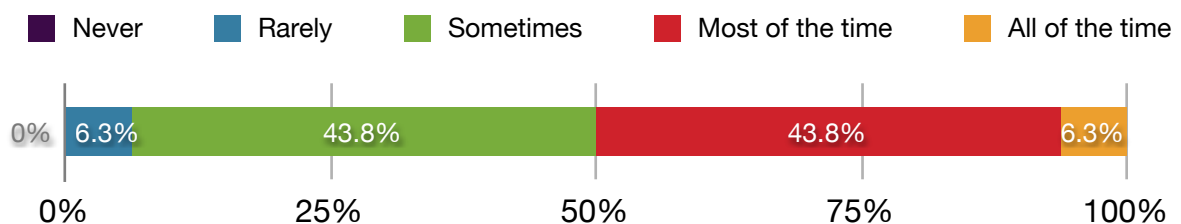
## Question 33: Which of the following causes you the greatest amount of stress?

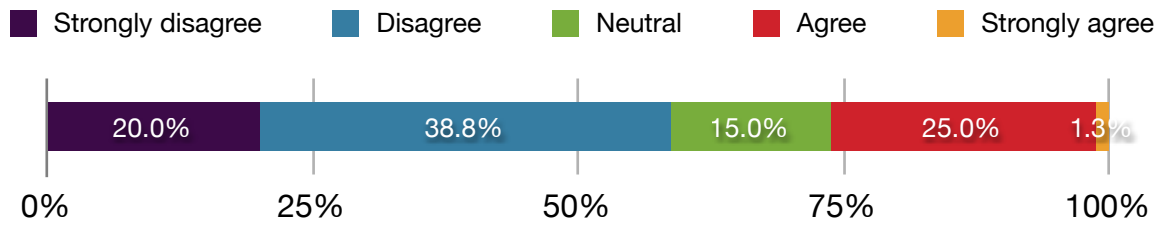
## Question 34: How often do you feel overwhelmed by your workload at law school?

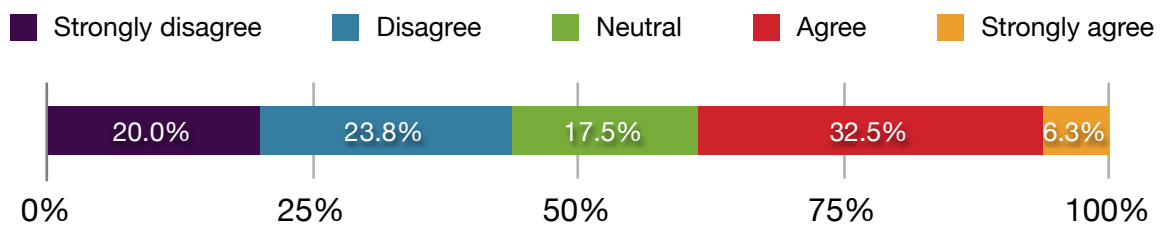
**Question 35: I would feel comfortable seeking support from law school staff if I was anxious, depressed or struggling psychologically.**

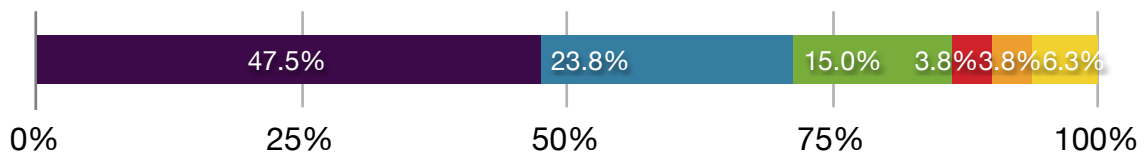

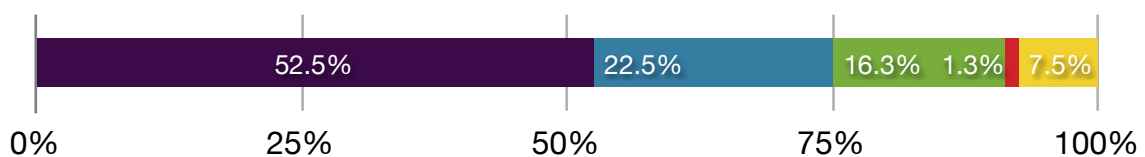

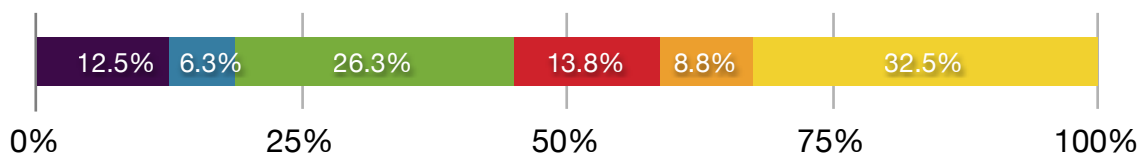

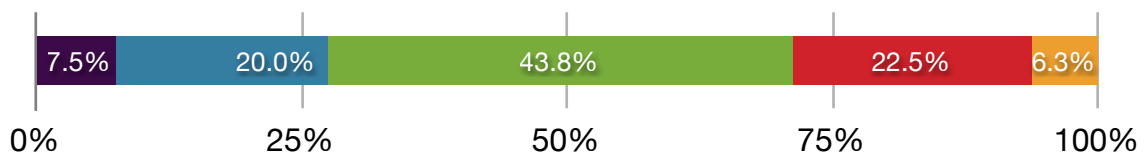


**Satisfaction Rating: Wellbeing**

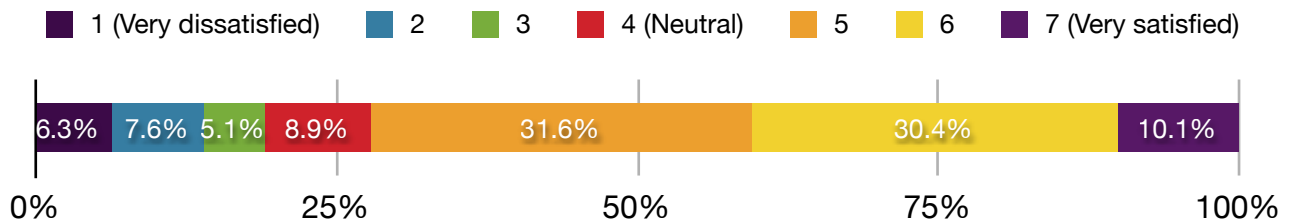

### Question 41: What do you like best about your law school and why?

- I found most of the tutors/lecturers very helpful, they are enthusiastic
- The quality of the teaching and the lack of pretentiousness. Also, a focus on human rights and the approach of law existing to facilitate equality.
- The range of subjects it offers and the academic staff are very helpful and approachable. The library has a great deal of resources that makes researching much more efficient.
- The reputation and the extraordinarily credentials of the teaching staff. As well as the like minded people and friends I have met. I also believe the ANU Law Library is very well resourced with computers usually easy to come by if required.
- Very good academically and a good social justice focus.

### Question 42: What about your law school would you most like to see improved and why?

- Time of the lecture/tutorial, some of them tend to be held in an absurd time. More information on job opportunities would be absolutely desirable
- More tutorials, and smaller classes. Often we have only 6 or less tutorials, they are large and impersonal, and by the time they start I'm already lost.
- I think the banding scale (Bell Curve, or whatever) creates a negative environment, it makes students very competitive and if you are a day student it means you are likely to have few good friends. This contributes negatively to your overall experience at university. Additionally, the ANU specific grading bands aren't reflective of other university's.
- Showing students what opportunities are out there after law school.
- Need more facilities; compared to the Science buildings at ANU the Law School is old. The Law Library is very small and we only have one building for the entire faculty. Given the higher fees I pay, I would expect better facilities, however I have no issue with the quality of the education.
