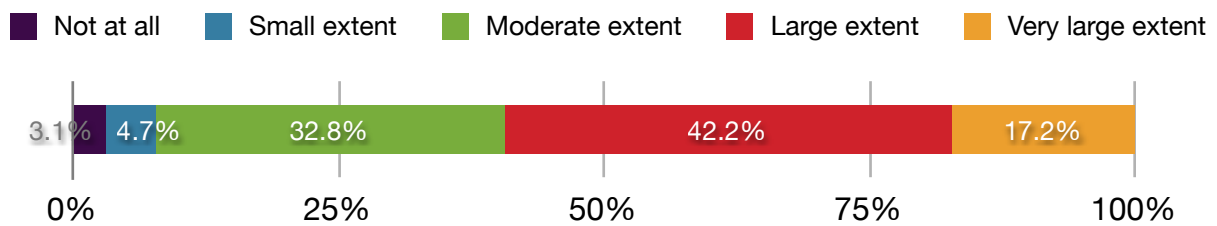

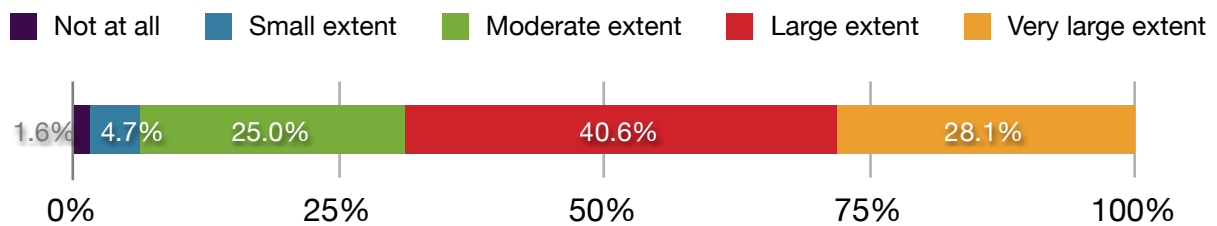

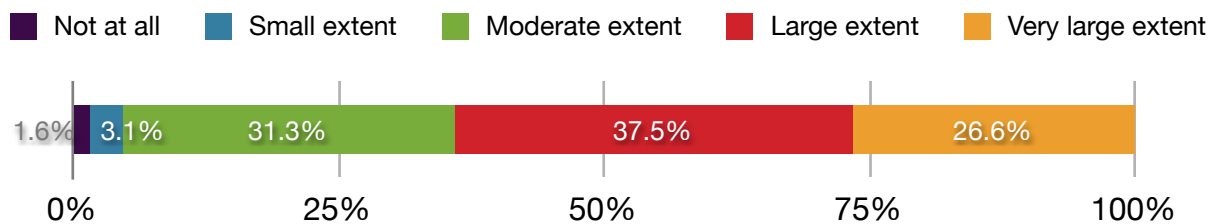
a) Shown that they care about your learning outcomes?



b) Been helpful and approachable?



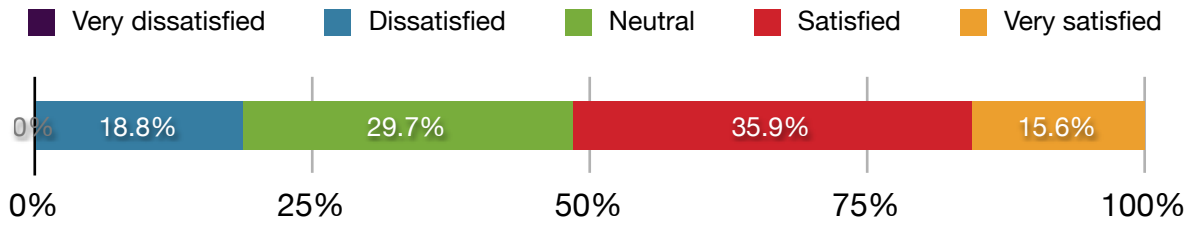
c) Created an engaging learning environment?



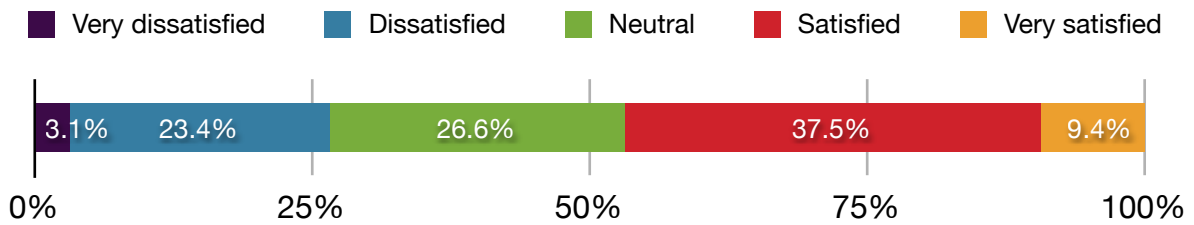

a) The quality of the feedback that you receive on assessments?

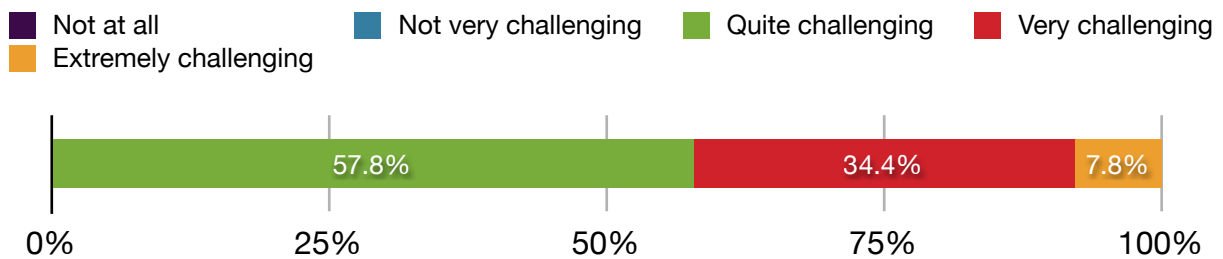


b) the timeliness of the feedback that you receive on assessments?



Question 14: How challenging have you found your assessments?

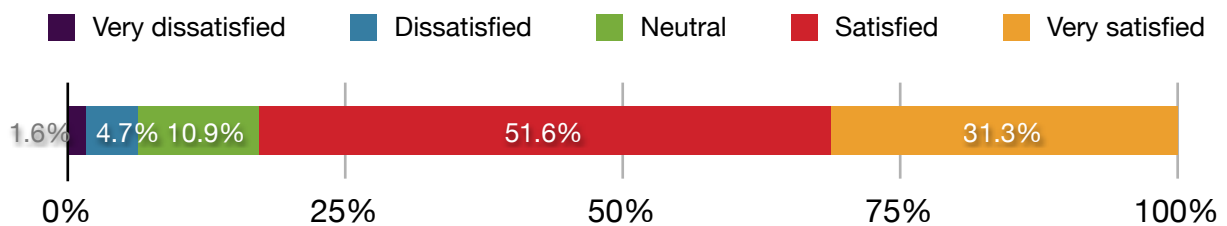

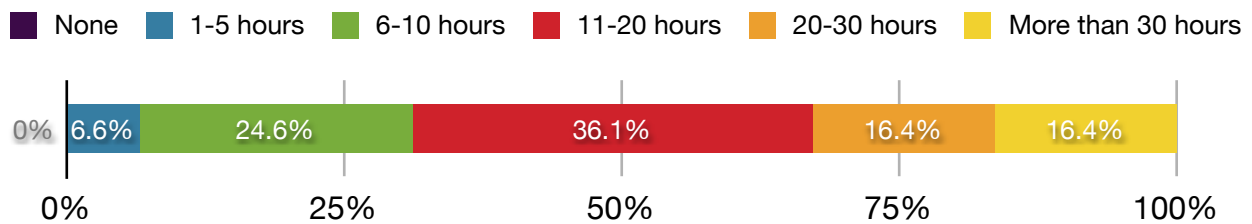

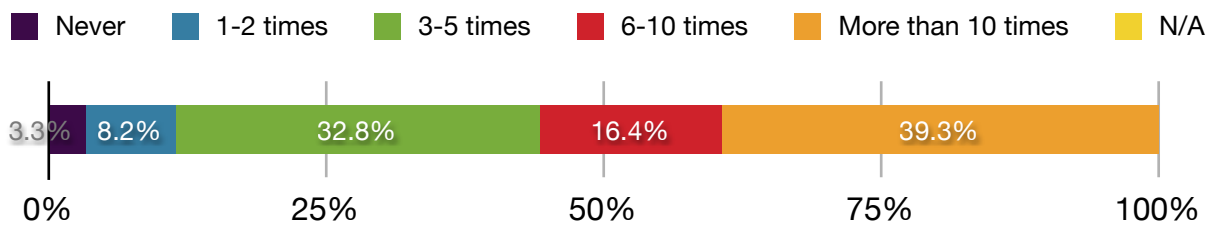
Question 16: During semester, how many hours do you spend studying (including preparing for class) each week?

Question 17: How often do you visit your law school/university library (as opposed to using online library resources) in a typical semester?

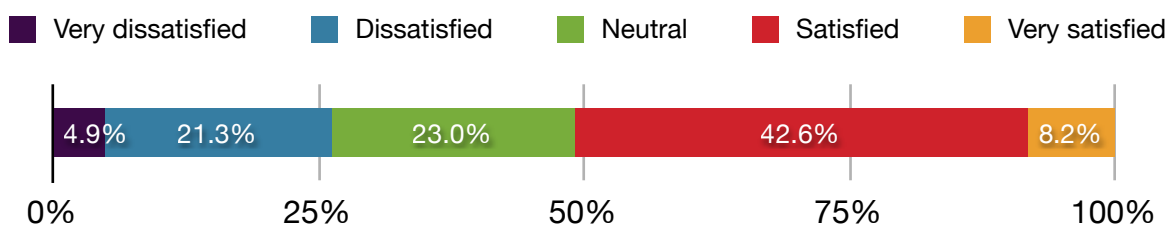

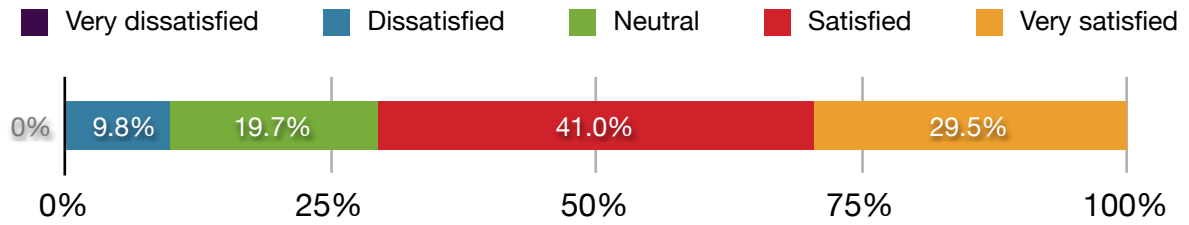

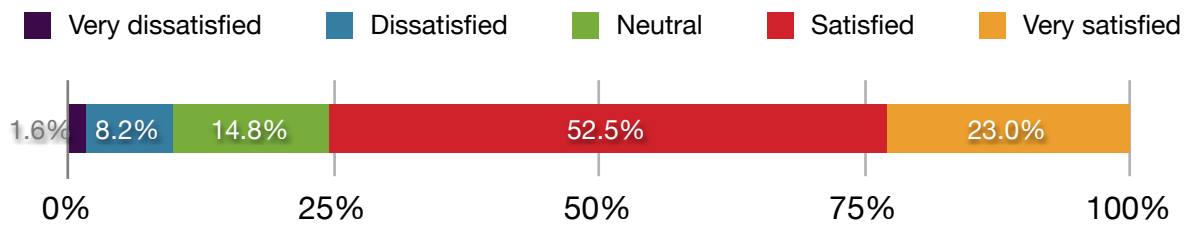
b) The online resources available to support your study, such as study forums

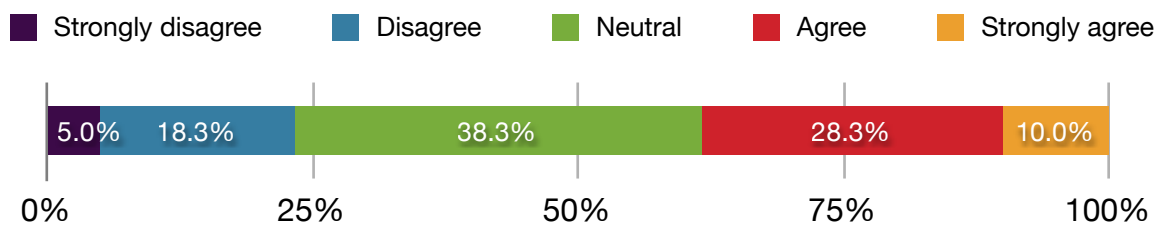

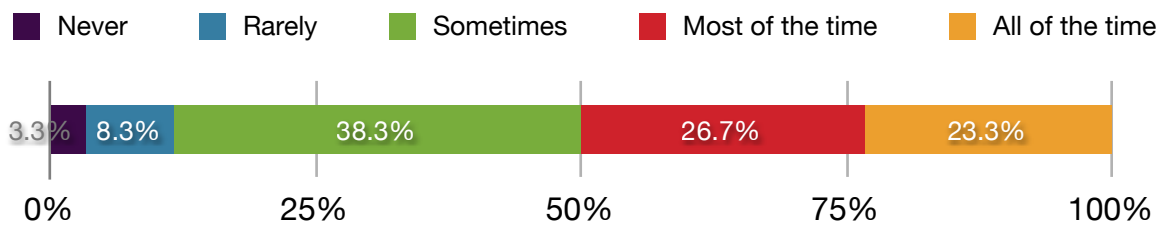
Question 20: I believe my law school is highly regarded by employers.

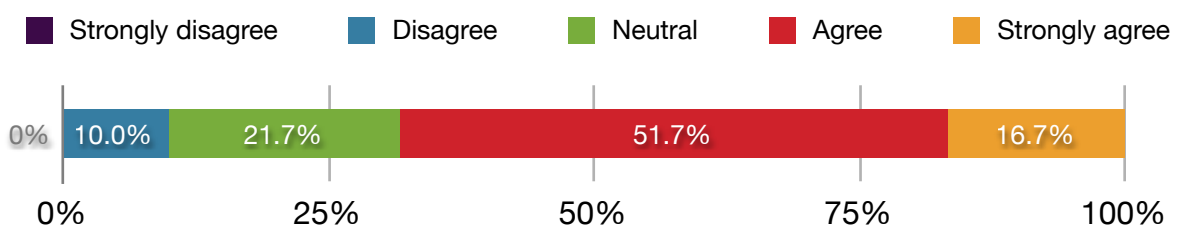
Question 21: How often do you feel stressed about finding a relevant job after you graduate?

Question 22: My law school provides sufficient information about work experience/employment opportunities.

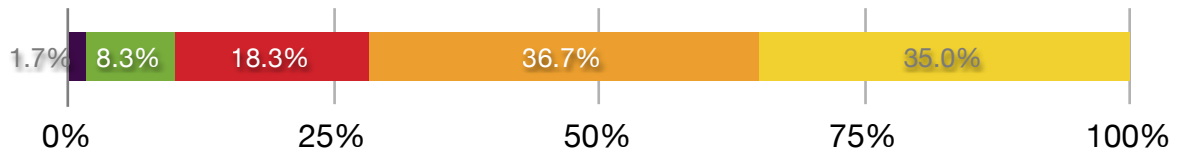

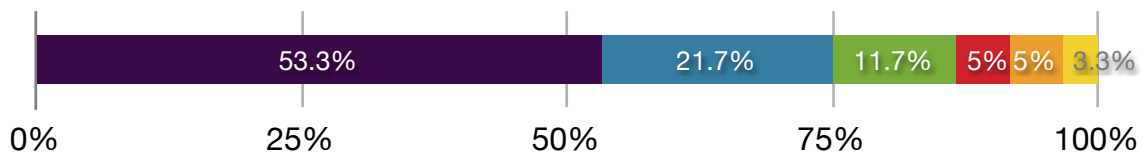

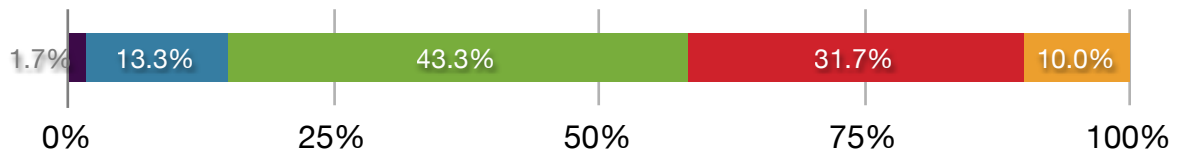

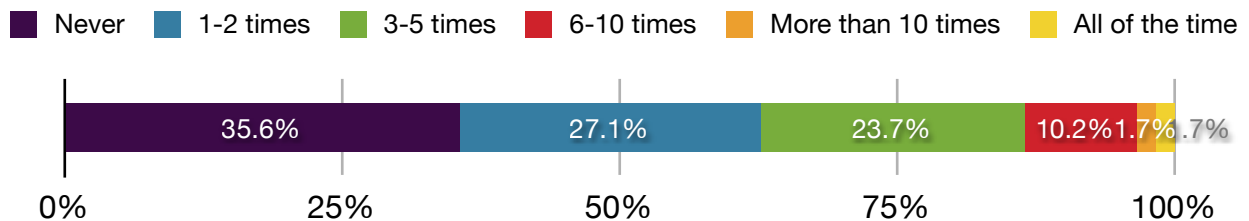
Question 26: I enjoy spending time on campus at my law school

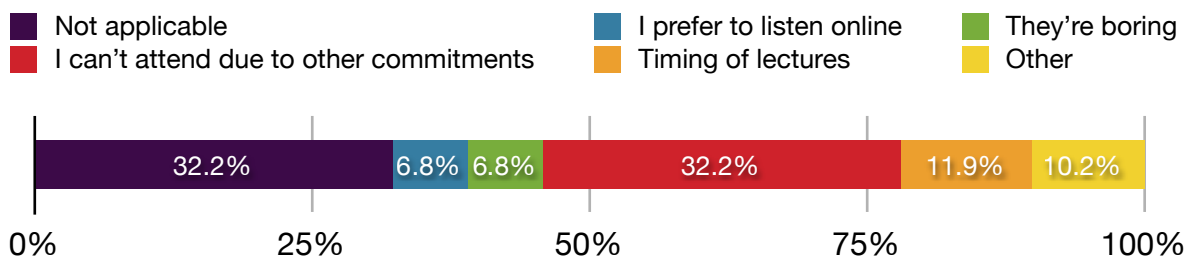
Question 27: How often do you skip lectures in a typical semester, other than as a result of illness?

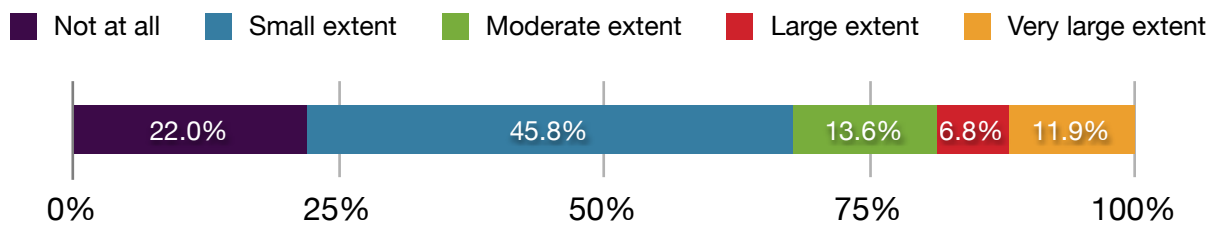
Question 28: What is your main reason for skipping lectures?

Question 29: To what extent have you taken part in extra-curricular activities such as legal competitions, social events and clubs at your law school?

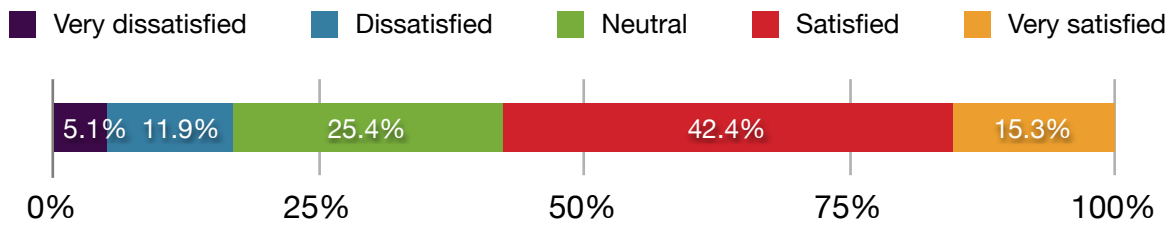

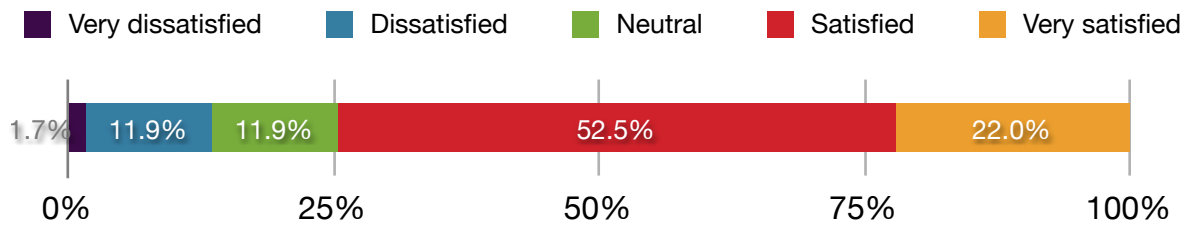

a) the range of extra-curricular activities available at your law school?



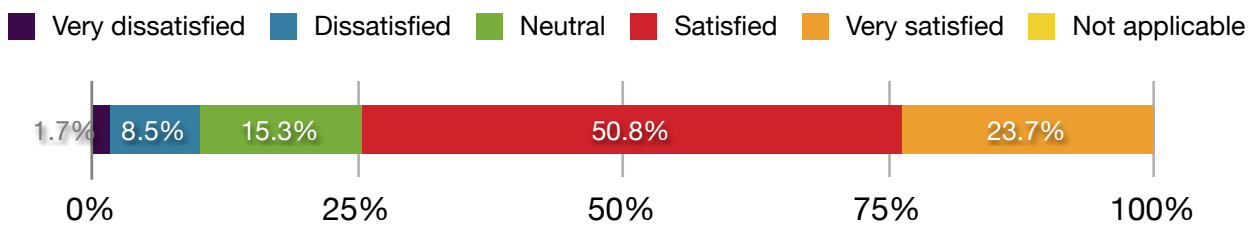
b) learning facilities at your law school, such as lecture halls and classrooms?

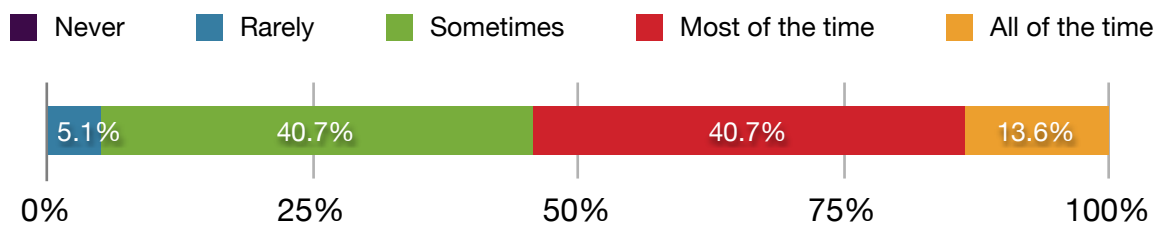

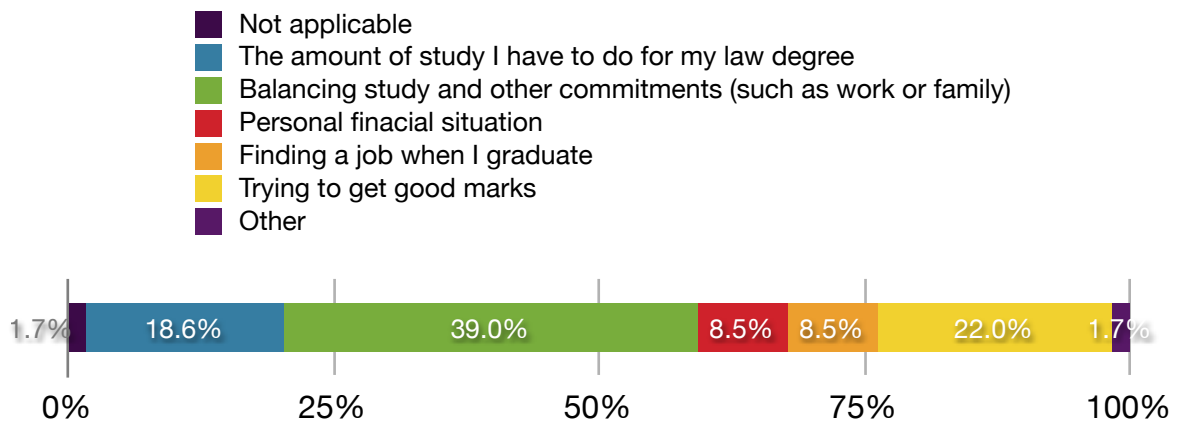
Question 32: How often do you feel stressed at law school?

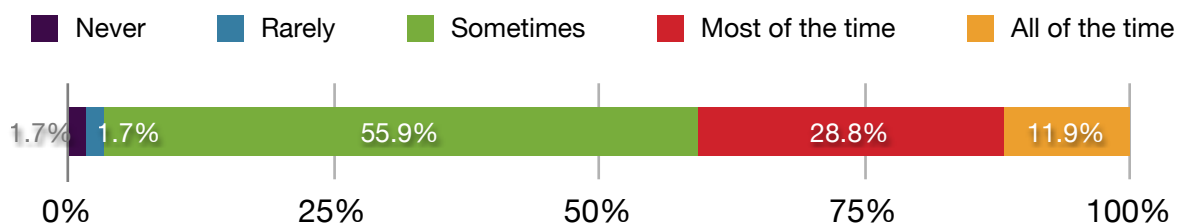
Question 33: Which of the following causes you the greatest amount of stress?

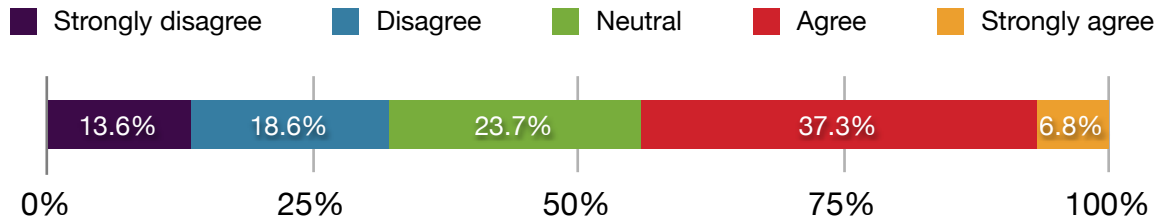
Question 34: How often do you feel overwhelmed by your workload at law school?

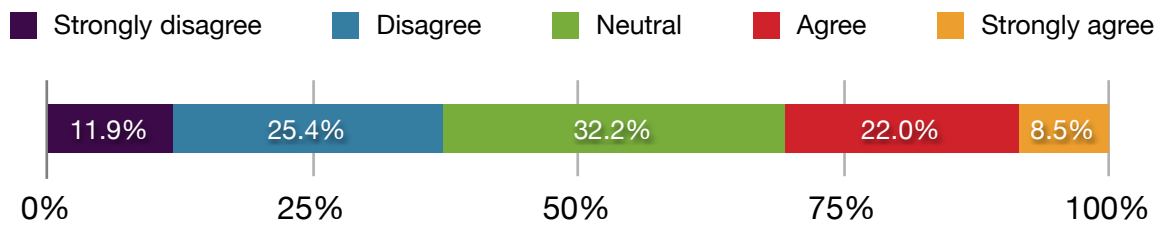
Question 35: I would feel comfortable seeking support from law school staff if I was anxious, depressed or struggling psychologically.

Question 36: I would feel comfortable seeking support from other law students if I was anxious, depressed or struggling psychologically.

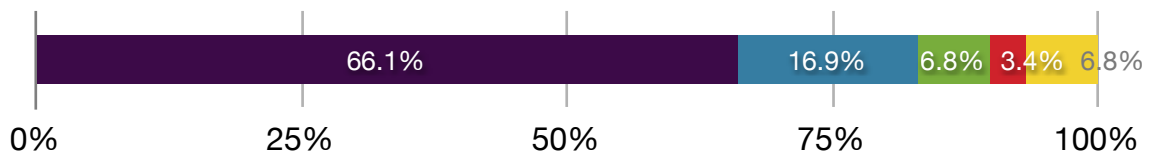
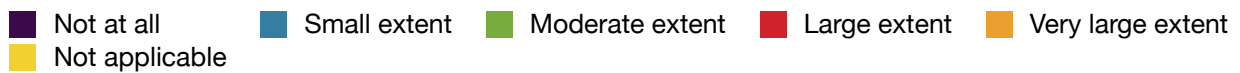

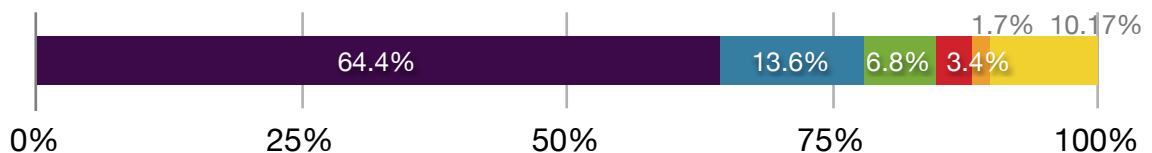
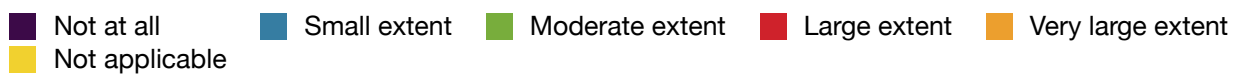
Question 37: To what extent have you used university provided:

b) Peer mentoring

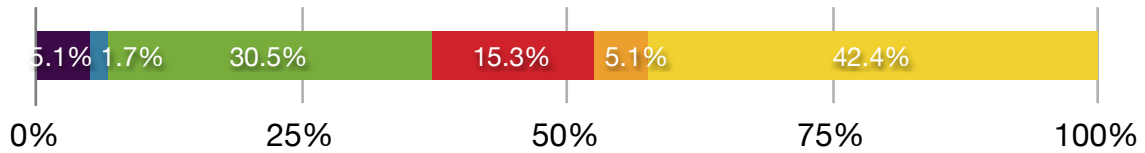

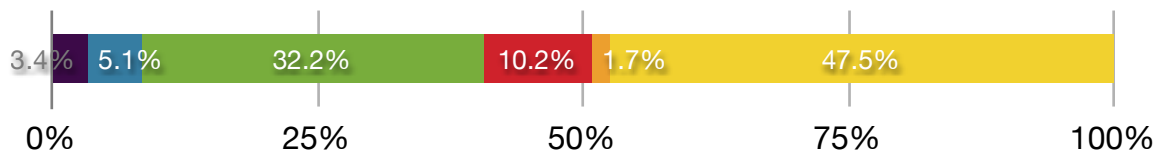

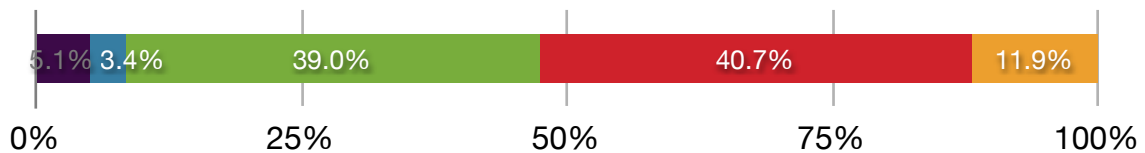

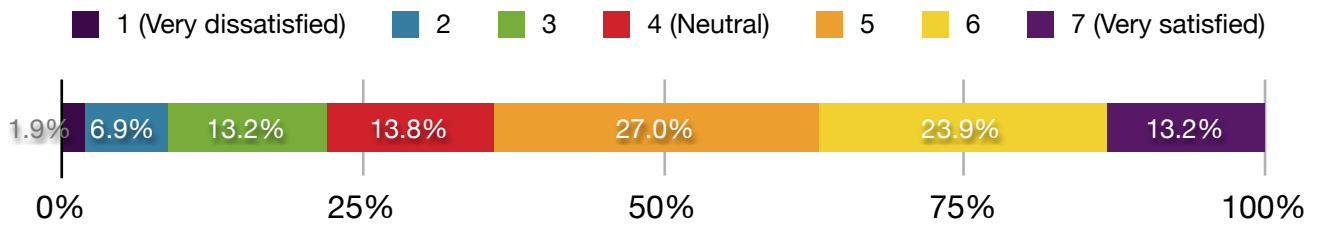

Overview

Question 41: What do you like best about your law school and why?

-Brilliant staff and teachers who show a genuine interest in students and have a passion for teaching. I am yet to encounter a lecturer or tutor whom I do not like or who has made me feel as though I am not a priority.

-Firstly, the quality of teaching is extremely high. The lecturers are very up to date in their respective fields and as such, demand a high standard from students. Secondly, the fast track nature of the course, and the ability to incorporate an honours degree into the final year of study, provided the necessary prerequisites are met are extremely appealing.

-The amount of practical application of skills we are given throughout the duration of our degree. Because it prepares us better for "real world" employment rather than just being book smart with no practical skills.

-That it's in trimesters, not semesters. You can get your degree finished quicker and the law students have the whole uni to themselves when every other degree is doing exams or on holidays.

-There is a good practical focus. We get to experience moots, legal submissions, question witnesses, present guilty pleas, etc. There is good opportunity to apply our theoretical knowledge.

Question 42: What about your law school would you most like to see improved and why?

-Integration with the legal community. There is very little connection between the law school and law firms within the city.

-A wider range of electives to be offered because the current selection is too limited compared with electives offered by other law schools.

-I would like to see more extra-curricular activities available at times which consider the needs of students with family commitments. There is a high percentage of mature age students at this campus and generally, activities take place at times which cannot be worked around by single parents such as myself.

-Timetabling - offering compulsory courses in more than one trimester each year.

-Recording all lectures, as this does not happen at present - Offer some classes outside work hours, it is especially important for those students who work full-time.
